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1. INTRODUCTION

Cleary University is committed to providing a safe environment for students, faculty, staff, visitors, and guests.

Fire safety is a shared responsibility. The University maintains a comprehensive fire safety program designed to prevent fires, provide early notification of fire emergencies, support safe evacuation, maintain fire protection systems, educate members of the University community, and coordinate emergency response activities with appropriate authorities.

This Annual Fire Safety Report provides information regarding Cleary University's fire safety policies, procedures, programs, fire protection systems, fire drills, fire safety education, and reported fire incidents for the 2023, 2024, and 2025 calendar years.

The report is maintained by the Office of Campus Operations and is made available to members of the University community and prospective students and employees in accordance with applicable requirements.

2. PURPOSE OF THE ANNUAL FIRE SAFETY REPORT

The purpose of this report is to:

- Provide the University community with information regarding fire safety.
- Identify fire prevention practices and responsibilities.
- Describe emergency evacuation procedures.
- Provide information concerning fire protection systems.
- Document fire drills conducted during the reporting period.
- Provide fire safety education and training information.
- Report applicable fire incidents occurring in University residential facilities.
- Identify fire safety policies applicable to students, employees, and visitors.
- Support continuous improvement of the University's fire safety program.

The University reviews this report annually and updates the information as necessary.

3. UNIVERSITY FIRE SAFETY PROGRAM

The Cleary University fire safety program is administered through the Office of Campus Operations in coordination with Housing, Campus Safety/Security, Facilities, University leadership, local fire authorities, emergency medical services, and other applicable departments.

The University's fire safety program includes:

- Fire prevention.
- Fire alarm and detection systems.
- Automatic sprinkler systems.
- Portable fire extinguishers.
- Emergency lighting.
- Exit signage.
- Fire drills.
- Emergency evacuation procedures.
- Fire safety inspections.
- Fire safety education and training.
- Fire incident reporting.
- Maintenance and testing of fire protection systems.
- Emergency response planning.
- Coordination with local fire authorities.
- Corrective action and hazard mitigation.

Campus Operations works with appropriate University departments to identify fire safety deficiencies and coordinate corrective actions.

4. FIRE SAFETY RESPONSIBILITIES

Fire safety is the responsibility of every member of the Cleary University community.

4.1 Office of Campus Operations

Campus Operations is responsible for coordinating the University's facilities-related fire safety program, including:

- Fire protection system maintenance and coordination.
- Fire safety inspections.
- Fire drill coordination.
- Fire safety documentation.

- Emergency preparedness.
- Corrective action tracking.
- Coordination with local fire departments.
- Fire safety communications.
- Building fire safety assessments.

4.2 Housing

Housing is responsible for communicating residential fire safety requirements to residents and coordinating with Campus Operations regarding:

- Resident fire safety education.
- Fire drills.
- Evacuation procedures.
- Fire safety concerns.
- Resident notification.
- Residential fire incidents.

4.3 Campus Safety/Security

Campus Safety/Security supports emergency response, emergency notifications, building evacuation, incident documentation, and coordination with emergency responders.

4.4 Faculty and Staff

Faculty and staff are expected to:

- Follow University emergency procedures.
- Evacuate when a fire alarm sounds.
- Direct students and visitors toward safe exits when appropriate.
- Report fire hazards.
- Participate in required fire safety training and drills.

4.5 Students and Residents

Students and residents are expected to:

- Follow University fire safety policies.
- Immediately evacuate when a fire alarm sounds.
- Keep emergency exits and corridors clear.
- Report fire safety hazards.
- Never tamper with fire protection equipment.
- Never disable smoke detectors.
- Follow instructions provided by University personnel and emergency responders.

5. FIRE SAFETY POLICIES

All students, employees, residents, visitors, and contractors are required to comply with applicable University fire safety policies and applicable fire safety codes.

Prohibited or restricted activities include, but are not limited to:

- Tampering with fire alarms.
- Tampering with smoke detectors.
- Tampering with sprinkler systems.
- Blocking emergency exits.
- Blocking fire extinguishers.
- Propping open fire-rated doors where prohibited.
- Disabling emergency lighting or exit signage.
- Unauthorized open flames.
- Unauthorized candles or incense.
- Unauthorized cooking appliances.
- Improper storage of combustible materials.
- Improper use of electrical equipment.
- Indoor use of grills or similar equipment.
- Unauthorized hazardous materials.
- Storage of items in exit pathways.
- Improper charging or storage of lithium-ion battery devices.

Violations of University fire safety policies may result in corrective or disciplinary action in accordance with applicable University policies.

6. RESIDENTIAL FIRE SAFETY

Students residing in University housing are expected to understand and follow all residential fire safety requirements.

Residents should:

1. Know the location of their building's emergency exits.
2. Know the location of fire alarm pull stations.
3. Know the location of fire extinguishers.
4. Keep hallways, stairways, and exits clear.
5. Never disable or cover smoke detectors.
6. Never tamper with sprinkler heads.

7. Never hang objects from 'sprinkler pipes or sprinkler heads.
 8. Report damaged or malfunctioning fire safety equipment immediately.
 9. Evacuate whenever the fire alarm sounds.
 10. Never re-enter an evacuated building until authorized by emergency personnel.
 11. Follow instructions from University personnel and emergency responders.

7. FIRE PREVENTION

Preventing fires is a shared responsibility.

Members of the University community should:

- Keep combustible materials away from heat-producing equipment.
 - Avoid overloading electrical outlets.
 - Use electrical equipment according to manufacturer instructions.
 - Report damaged electrical cords or equipment.
 - Maintain clear emergency exits.
 - Keep fire doors and corridors unobstructed.
 - Properly dispose of combustible materials.
 - Follow University policies regarding cooking equipment.
 - Report unusual odors, smoke, sparks, or other potential hazards.
 - Never disable or tamper with fire protection equipment.

8. FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEMS AND EQUIPMENT

Clarey University maintains fire protection systems and equipment throughout applicable University facilities.

Depending upon the building, fire protection systems may include:

- Fire alarm systems.
- Smoke detectors.
- Heat detectors.
- Manual fire alarm pull stations.
- Automatic sprinkler systems.
- Portable fire extinguishers.
- Emergency lighting.
- Exit signage.

- Fire department connections.
- Kitchen hood suppression systems.
- Other specialized fire protection equipment.

Fire protection systems are inspected, tested, and maintained in accordance with applicable requirements, manufacturer specifications, and University procedures.

9. FIRE ALARM AND DETECTION SYSTEMS

Fire alarm systems are intended to provide early notification to building occupants and emergency responders.

Depending upon building design, fire alarm systems may include:

- Smoke detectors.
- Heat detectors.
- Manual pull stations.
- Audible notification appliances.
- Visual notification appliances.
- Fire alarm control panels.
- Monitoring systems.
- Automatic notification to emergency monitoring services.

Fire alarm systems are subject to inspection, testing, and maintenance in accordance with applicable requirements.

Any person who observes a malfunctioning fire alarm device, smoke detector, pull station, or other fire protection equipment should immediately report the condition to Campus Operations or the appropriate University emergency contact.

10. AUTOMATIC SPRINKLER SYSTEMS

Automatic sprinkler systems are installed in applicable University facilities.

Sprinkler systems are designed to respond automatically to elevated temperatures associated with a developing fire.

Occupants must never:

- Hang items from sprinkler heads.
- Obstruct sprinkler heads.
- Paint sprinkler heads.
- Tamper with sprinkler valves.
- Damage sprinkler equipment.
- Store materials in a manner that interferes with sprinkler coverage.

Any suspected sprinkler malfunction or damage should be reported immediately.

11. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

Portable fire extinguishers are provided in designated areas throughout applicable University facilities.

Fire extinguishers must remain:

- Accessible.
- Clearly identified.
- Unobstructed.
- Properly mounted or positioned.
- Properly maintained.

University personnel should not attempt to fight a fire unless they have received appropriate training, the fire is small and manageable, an appropriate extinguisher is available, and a safe evacuation route remains available.

The primary responsibility of building occupants during a fire emergency is to evacuate safely.

12. EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURES

When a fire alarm sounds, occupants should immediately evacuate the building unless directed otherwise by emergency personnel.

General Evacuation Procedure

- 1. Remain calm.**
 - 2. Stop all activities.**
 - 3. Exit using the nearest safe exit.**
 - 4. Do not use elevators unless specifically directed by emergency personnel.**
 - 5. Close doors behind you when possible.**
 - 6. Assist individuals requiring assistance when it is safe to do so.**
 - 7. Proceed to the designated assembly area.**
 - 8. Remain away from the building.**
 - 9. Do not re-enter the building until authorized by emergency personnel.**
 - 10. Do not interfere with responding emergency personnel.**
-

13. FIRE DRILLS

Cleary University conducts fire drills in applicable University facilities as part of its emergency preparedness and fire safety program.

Fire drills are intended to:

- Familiarize occupants with emergency exits.
- Evaluate evacuation procedures.
- Test emergency notification procedures.
- Evaluate evacuation times.
- Identify potential evacuation obstacles.
- Provide fire safety education.
- Evaluate emergency response procedures.
- Identify opportunities for corrective action.

Fire drills may be coordinated with local fire authorities when appropriate.

15. REPORTING A FIRE OR FIRE SAFETY HAZARD

Any person who discovers a fire or observes signs of fire should immediately:

1. Activate the nearest fire alarm.
2. Call **911**.
3. Provide the building name and location.
4. Evacuate the building.
5. Move to the designated assembly area.
6. Notify Campus Operations or Campus Safety when it is safe to do so.

19. E-BIKES, E-SCOOTERS AND LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES

Cleary University recognizes the potential fire hazards associated with lithium-ion batteries and electrically powered mobility devices.

The storage, charging, and use of e-bikes, e-scooters, and similar devices inside University buildings, residence halls, or other University structures shall comply with University policy and applicable fire safety requirements.

Where prohibited, these devices may not be:

- Stored inside University buildings.
- Charged inside University buildings.
- Stored in hallways or exit routes.
- Stored in stairwells.
- Stored in locations that obstruct fire protection equipment.
- Modified in a manner inconsistent with manufacturer requirements.

Users should:

- Use manufacturer-approved chargers.
- Follow manufacturer charging instructions.
- Inspect batteries and charging equipment for damage.
- Discontinue use of damaged batteries.
- Never modify battery packs.
- Never block emergency exits with bicycles or scooters.
- Follow University storage and charging requirements.

Any suspected battery failure, overheating, smoke, unusual odor, or other emergency condition should be reported immediately and treated as a potential fire emergency.

20. COORDINATION WITH LOCAL FIRE AUTHORITIES

Cleary University coordinates with appropriate local fire authorities and emergency response agencies.

Coordination may include:

- Fire inspections.
- Fire prevention activities.
- Fire drills.
- Emergency response planning.
- Building familiarization.
- Fire alarm response.
- Pre-incident planning.
- Emergency access planning.
- Fire safety education.
- Review of fire safety concerns.

The University recognizes the importance of maintaining current building information and emergency access information for responding fire personnel.
